PROTECT YOUR AUTO

- Park in a garage or near lights
- Close windows and lock doors
- Set car alarms to deter thieves

PROTECT YOUR HOME

- Avoid décor that can be easily thrown
- Pricey décor could entice thieves
- A well-lit home deters burglars
- If you have a home security system, post a sign saying so

PROTECT THE KIDS

Visitor Safety

- Keep pets inside
- Light your walkway

Appropriate Costumes

- Wear comfortable shoes
- Ensure visibility through masks

Drive Extra Safe

- Slow down
- Anticipate heavy pedestrian traffic
- Turn headlights on early

TRICK-OR-TREAT

- Children under 12 should always be supervised by an adult
- Always walk on sidewalks or paths, and cross streets at corners with traffic signals
- Increase visibility with a flashlight and reflective clothing
- Give extra caution when driving. Be alert – no cell phones!

INSPECT THE TREATS

- Tell kids not to accept or eat homemade treats
- Inspect commercially wrapped candy for signs of tampering
- If you have young children, remove any choking hazards such as gum, hard candy, or small toys
